28th July – 7th August, 2001
Pamporovo, Bulgaria

This issue contains the scientific reports presented as mini-talks (15 min), seminar talks (45 min), and posters at the 2nd International Pamporovo Workshop (2nd IPW) on *Cooperative Phenomena in Condensed Matter* devoted to *QUANTUM PHASES AND PHASE TRANSITIONS*. The Workshop was held from 28th July to 7th August 2001 in Pamporovo (Bulgaria). All published papers have been selected after a refereeing and discussion during the 2nd IPW, as well after an additional refereeing and edition by the JPS.



As far as the total number of pages of the papers exceeds the maximal size of a single journal issue, the proceedings appear in a doubled issue of JPS.

The IPW is organized every third year to provide an informal arena of discussions on current topics in experimental and theoretical physics of condensed matter (with a special emphasis on the theory), for a promotion of new results, for teaching research students and young scientists, and for a consideration of joint projects. The first Workshop in this series was held at the same place in 1998. For the Proceedings of research papers, see: *Journal of Phys.
